...can such a breakup actually take place.

Only by two, separate individuals pursuing their own individual paths and following, what to they is, the God of their own cho ice can two people who were once so close end up...

Art? Art, try and work it in that I'll be doing a major college tour this fall.

...who were once so close, follow two paths which are so diverg ent, whereby, I, for example, record material that I feel expre sses my soul, and you, Paul, who are doing a major college tour (laughs) this fall...
